This internship offers an exciting opportunity to contribute to improving the quality of educational information available to communities around the world, whose schools may lack electricity and/or Internet access. Your contributions will be brought to the field and used by teachers and students within months of your internship!

About SolarSPELL

SolarSPELL (Solar Powered Educational Learning Library) is a global educational initiative based at ASU. We create offline, solar-powered digital libraries designed for areas with little to no access to electricity or internet. Our libraries provide a WiFi hotspot that enables free access to curated educational resources via any smartphone, tablet, or laptop.

- Conduct in-depth research on the cultural, linguistic, and educational contexts of West African / Sub-Saharan African countries, with a preliminary focus on Senegal, Guinea and/or Guinea Bissau.
- Search for and evaluate open-access educational materials in Fulani to identify resources relevant to the West African / Sub-Saharan African context.
- Work closely with the SolarSPELL team to prioritize content needs and address feedback.

- Detail oriented and reliable; a strong and honest work ethic motivates you
