Ideal candidates will have a background or strong interest in small-scale agriculture, food systems, and the impacts of climate change on farming practices in sub-saharan Africa. Your contributions will directly support farmers and agricultural educators in communities that lack internet access and traditional libraries, helping them to adapt and thrive in changing climates.

We create offline, solar-powered digital libraries designed for areas with little to no access to electricity or internet.
