About the Internship

The Arizona Tribal Conservation Agriculture Content Curation Intern will support SolarSPELL's Arizona Tribal Digital Library for Conservation Agriculture project by researching, curating, and organizing culturally relevant educational resources focused on Indigenous agriculture, conservation agriculture, dryland farming, food sovereignty, and climate resilience. Working closely with the SolarSPELL team and partners from the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension, the interns will identify high-quality open-access materials, apply metadata and tagging standards, and help develop a specialized digital library collection tailored to the needs of Arizona Tribal communities. The intern will gain hands-on experience in digital library development, content curation, Indigenous knowledge preservation, and community-centered educational technology while contributing to a resource that will be showcased at the Arizona Tribal Farming Summit and used to support agricultural educators, extension agents, and farmers in low-connectivity environments.

About SolarSPELL

SolarSPELL (Solar Powered Educational Learning Library) is a global educational initiative based at ASU. We create offline, solar-powered digital libraries designed for areas with little to no access to electricity or internet. Our libraries provide a WiFi hotspot that enables free

access to curated educational resources via any smartphone, tablet, or laptop.

- Attend a new student orientation and participate in an end-of-semester presentation
- Complete content curation and metadata tagging trainings at the beginning of the semester
- Conduct research about farming and agricultural practices in Tribal locations within Arizona
- Curate locally-relevant content to the region, including topics like conservation agriculture, coffee production, and climate change
- Assist with metadata tagging and content organization
- Consistently communicate with your team members and SolarSPELL staff about your updates and progress throughout the semester

- Team player who works well collaboratively
- Detail-oriented, dependable, and driven by a strong work ethic
- Experienced in online research, content curation, or working with open-access resources
